

CANDIDATE'S PACKET
REGULAR DISTRICT ELECTION
MAY 17, 2005

FILING OF CANDIDACY - The first day to file is February 7, 2005 and the **last day to file is March 17, 2005 at 5:00 p.m.**

A candidate for election to a special district board may file for office in one of two ways:

1. BY FILING FEE:

Fill out and file with the Jackson County Elections Office the following forms:

- SEL 190 - Filing of Candidacy for Special District Nomination
- SEL 220 - Candidate's Statement of Organization (*unless the candidate is serving as his/her own treasurer, does not already have an open principal campaign committee and does not expect to receive or spend more than \$300 for the entire election*)

Pay the filing fee of \$10.00.

2. BY PETITION:

Fill out and file with the Jackson County Elections Office the following forms:

- SEL 190 - Filing of Candidacy for Special District Nomination
- SEL 191 - Special District Petition for Nomination Signature Sheet
- SEL 220 - Candidate's Statement of Organization (*unless the candidate is serving as his/her own treasurer, does not already have an open principal campaign committee and does not expect to receive or spend more than \$300 for the entire election*)

The petition sheets must be signed by at least 25 registered voters or 10 percent of the total registered voters in the district (whichever is less). If the candidate is nominated by zone, signers must also reside in the same zone.

All signatures must be verified by the Jackson County Elections Department in sufficient time for the verification process to be completed before 5:00 p.m. on the last day for filing the declaration of candidacy.

CONTRIBUTIONS AND EXPENDITURES

See the attached copy of General Information for Candidates. If you expect to exceed the \$300 limit, then contact the Elections Department for a Campaign Finance Manual.

JACKSON COUNTY VOTERS' PAMPHLET - The deadline for filing the completed candidate's statement, portraits and filing fees is **March 21, 2005 at 5:00 p.m.**

Candidates **may** submit a candidate's statement and photograph for publication in the Jackson County Voters' Pamphlet.

The filing fee for submitting a statement and photograph is \$25.00.

The *Candidate's Statement for County Voters' Pamphlet* form included in this packet must be used and both Parts One and Two must be typed. Word processing documents may be used for Parts One and Two by attaching them.

Statements may be filed without the portrait, but the fee remains the same.

Note: Candidate Statements and Portraits submitted with the filing fee are in addition to the biographical information that is listed for all candidates in the back of the pamphlet in the General Candidate Information section.

CANDIDATES FILING BY DECLARATION

Candidates Filing by Declaration (ORS 249.002-249.056, 255.012 and 255.235)

The following information for district candidates is provided in the order in which the activities generally occur and includes explanations and time frames for each activity. The information in this manual does not apply to candidates filing for a newly created district board. Contact the county elections official for information and requirements.

For district offices, special district statutory requirements may differ from state elections requirements. For more information and specific requirements, contact the county elections official before filing.

ALL CANDIDATES FOR DISTRICT OFFICE

Qualifications for various district offices differ. Before filing for district office, review the statutory requirements of the office for which you plan to declare your candidacy.

Candidates for district offices file under ORS Chapter 255.

Warning: *If a person has filed nominating petitions or declarations of candidacy for more than one lucrative office without first filing a written withdrawal, all such filings by the person are invalid. ORS 249.013(3).*

COUNTY ELECTIONS OFFICIAL

Whenever requested, the county elections official provides approved candidate filing forms:

- ♦ Filing of Candidacy for Special District Nomination (SEL 190); and
- ♦ Candidate's Statement of Organization (SEL 220).

DISTRICT CANDIDATES

Step 1:

A prospective candidate files a Candidate's Statement of Organization (SEL 220) with the county elections official unless the candidate:

- serves as the candidate's own treasurer;
- does not already have an open principal campaign committee; and
- does not expect to receive or spend more than \$300 for the entire election.

If the candidate meets these three requirements, the candidate is not required to file a Statement of Organization or contribution and expenditure reports. However, if at any time the candidate exceeds \$300 in either contributions or expenditures, the candidate must file a Statement of Organization and contribution and expenditure reports. The \$300 includes personal funds spent for any campaign-related costs, such as the candidate filing fee and voter pamphlet filing fee.

When to File

Within three business days of receiving a contribution or making an expenditure, but no later than when the Filing of Candidacy for Special District Nomination (SEL 190) is filed. See the *2004 Campaign Finance Manual* for specific guidelines and instructions.

If the candidate has an established principal campaign committee, the candidate or treasurer must file an amended Candidate's Statement of Organization (SEL 220) not later than the date of the filing of candidacy to reflect any changes (designation of office sought, applicable election, etc.) A candidate may have only one principal campaign committee.

Note: *If filing for a new office involves changing filing officers, e.g., county to state, refer to the "Changing Office" section of the 2004 Campaign Finance Manual.*

Step 2:

A prospective candidate files a completed Filing of Candidacy for Special District Nomination (SEL 190) accompanied by the appropriate fee with the county elections official.

When to File

For special district candidates, the filing period is:

- For primary or general elections, no sooner than the 110th day and no later than 5:00 p.m. on the 70th day before the election; or
- For regular district elections, or the first election at which members of a newly formed district board are elected, no sooner than the 101st day and no later than 5:00 p.m. on the 61st day before the election.

Consult with the county elections official to determine the actual filing deadline dates.

CANDIDATES FILING BY PETITION

Warning: If a person has filed nominating petitions or declarations of candidacy for more than one lucrative office without first filing a written withdrawal, all such filings by the person are invalid. ORS 249.013(3).

COUNTY ELECTIONS OFFICIAL

Whenever requested, the county elections official provides approved candidate filing forms:

- ♦ Candidate's Statement of Organization (SEL 220);
- ♦ Filing of Candidacy for Special District Nomination (SEL 190); and
- ♦ Special District Petition for Nomination Signature Sheet (SEL 191).

DISTRICT CANDIDATES

Step 1:

A prospective candidate files a Candidate's Statement of Organization (SEL 220) with the county elections official unless the candidate:

- serves as the candidate's own treasurer;
- does not already have an open principal campaign committee; and
- does not expect to receive or spend more than \$300 for the entire election.

If the candidate meets these three requirements, the candidate is not required to file a Statement of Organization or contribution and expenditure reports. However, if at any time the candidate exceeds \$300 in either contributions or expenditures, the candidate must file a Statement of Organization and contribution and expenditure reports. The \$300 includes personal funds spent for any campaign-related costs, such as any expenses incurred in circulating a nominating petition and paying a voters' pamphlet statement filing fee.

Candidates Filing by Petition (ORS 249.064, 249.076, 255.012 and 255.235)

The following information for district candidates is provided in the order in which the activities generally occur and includes explanations and time frames for each activity. Contact the county elections official for information and requirements.

For district offices, special district statutory requirements may differ from state elections statutes. For more information and specific requirements, contact the county elections official before filing.

ALL CANDIDATES FOR DISTRICT OFFICE

Qualifications for various district offices differ. Before filing for district office, review the statutory requirements of the office for which you plan to declare your candidacy.

Candidates for district offices file under ORS Chapter 255.

When to File

Within three business days of receiving a contribution or making an expenditure, but no later than when the completed petition is filed. See the *2004 Campaign Finance Manual* for specific guidelines and instructions.

If the candidate has an established principal campaign committee, the candidate or treasurer must file an amended Candidate's Statement of Organization (SEL 220) not later than the date of the filing of candidacy to reflect any changes (designation of office sought, applicable election, etc.) A candidate may have only one principal campaign committee.

Step 2:

A prospective candidate completes the candidate forms:

- ♦ Filing of Candidacy for Special District Nomination (SEL 190); and
- ♦ Special District Petition for Nomination Signature Sheet (SEL 191).

Step 3:

A prospective candidate circulates the nominating petition (SEL 191):

- ♦ Obtaining more than the required number of signatures to ensure the petition contains a sufficient number of valid signatures of active registered voters;
- ♦ Ensuring all signatures on any one petition sheet must be from the same county;
- ♦ Ensuring all signatures are original signatures;
- ♦ Ensuring all signatures on the petition are verified by the county elections official in sufficient time for the verification process to be completed before 5:00 p.m. on the last day for filing the declaration of candidacy; and
- ♦ Ensuring signatures of electors from more than one county in a multi-county district are verified by each appropriate county elections official before being submitted to the district elections official.

See page 10 of this manual for signature requirements.

When to Submit Signatures

No later than 5:00 p.m. on the 70th day before the date of the Primary or General Election; no later than 5:00 p.m. on the 61st day before a regular district election or the first election at which members of the district board are elected.

Step 4:

The candidate files the completed petition with the county elections official by submitting the nominating petition with the sufficient number of signatures verified by each appropriate county elections official.

When to File Petition

Submit no sooner than the 110th day and no later than 5:00 p.m. on the 70th day before the Primary, or General Election; no sooner than the 101st day and no later than 5:00 p.m. on the 61st day before a regular district election or the first election at which members of the district board are elected.

GENERAL INFORMATION FOR CANDIDATES

General Information

The following information gives a general overview of other procedures relating to candidates filing for office, including submitting a voters' pamphlet statement, withdrawal of candidacy, contribution and expenditure reporting, conduct of elections and definitions of election law terminology.

Voters' Pamphlet (ORS Chapter 251)

Counties may publish county voters' pamphlets for any election. Contact your county elections official for the filing information and requirements.

District candidates are not eligible to submit statements for publication in the state voters' pamphlet, with the exception of metropolitan service district candidates.

Withdrawal of Candidacy or Nomination (ORS 255.235)

ALL CANDIDATES

In order to withdraw from candidacy or nomination, a candidate must file a Withdrawal of Candidacy or Nomination (SEL 150).

When to Withdraw

No later than 5:00 p.m. on the 70th day before a Primary or General Election; no later than 5:00 p.m. on the 61st day before a regular district election or the first election at which members of the district board are elected.

Contribution and Expenditure Reporting (ORS Chapter 260)

A prospective candidate files a Candidate's Statement of Organization (SEL 220) with the county elections official unless the candidate:

- serves as the candidate's own treasurer;
- does not already have an open principal campaign committee; and
- does not expect to receive or spend more than \$300 for the entire election.

If the candidate meets these three requirements, the candidate is not required to file a Statement of Organization or contribution and expenditure reports. However, if at any time the candidate exceeds \$300 in either contributions or expenditures, the candidate must file a Statement of Organization and contribution and expenditure reports. The \$300 includes personal funds spent for any campaign-related costs, such as any expenses incurred in circulating a nominating petition and paying a voters' pamphlet statement filing fee.

When to File

Within three business days of receiving a contribution or making an expenditure, but no later than when candidacy papers are filed.

Step 2:

A candidate or the candidate's treasurer files contribution and expenditure reports for the election. "Candidate" includes:

- ♦ A candidate who files for office;
- ♦ A candidate who withdraws or is disqualified;

- ♦ An individual who files a prospective petition for candidacy, even if signatures are never filed; and
- ♦ An individual who has received a contribution or made an expenditure to secure the nomination or election to any public office at any time, whether or not the office for which the individual will seek nomination or election is known when the solicitation is made, the contribution is received and retained or the expenditure is made, and whether or not the name of the individual is printed on a ballot.

Oregon Election Law requires all candidates or their principal campaign committees to submit timely and accurate contribution and expenditure reports. All candidates and committees must maintain detailed records of all contributions received and expenditures made. The statutes on campaign finance establish accounting periods and filing deadlines for reports of contributions and expenditures and specify the information that must be included in the reports. In addition, the statutes provide for civil penalties up to \$10,000 for filing late or insufficient reports.

A candidate or committee that does not expect to receive or spend more than \$2,000 to support a candidacy **may** qualify to file a Certificate of Limited Contributions and Expenditures (PC 7). See the *2004 Campaign Finance Manual* for information on who is eligible to file a certificate.

The candidate and treasurer are jointly responsible for the committee and for filing the contribution and expenditure reports. If the treasurer violates any campaign finance regulations, the candidate is also in violation.

See the *2004 Campaign Finance Manual*:

- ♦ To determine when your committee is required to file reports;
- ♦ For the appropriate forms for filing the reports; and
- ♦ For instructions on how to complete the contribution and expenditure report forms.

Signature Requirements For Candidate Nominating Petitions (ORS 249.072 and 255.235)

Electors' signatures on candidate nominating petitions must be verified by the appropriate county elections official before filing the candidate's completed petition with the county elections official.

DISTRICT BOARD NOMINATION (EXCEPT METROPOLITAN SERVICE DISTRICT)

The number of verified signatures required to place a candidate on the ballot for district board nomination is the lesser of:

- ♦ 25 electors' signatures; or
- ♦ *Ten percent* of the total number of active registered voters in the electoral district.

METROPOLITAN SERVICE DISTRICT NOMINATION

The number of verified signatures required to place a candidate on the ballot for metropolitan service district is the lesser of:

- ♦ 500 electors' signatures; or
- ♦ *One percent* of the votes cast in the electoral district for all candidates for Governor at the last general election at which a candidate for Governor was elected to a full term.

If the office is to be voted for in more than *one* county, the signatures shall include those of voters registered in at least *six percent* of the precincts in each of *two or more* counties, or portions of the counties, within which the electoral district is located. If *six percent* of the precincts of the electoral district in *one* of the counties, or portion thereof, does not constitute a whole precinct, the nominating petition shall contain signatures from at least *one* precinct in that county.

The completed form must be filed within three business days of first receiving a contribution or making an expenditure. A date stamped copy, which includes your identification number, will be returned to you as an acknowledgment of your filing. NOTE: A candidate may have only one principal campaign committee.

A candidate who serves as the treasurer

A candidate may either serve as the candidate's own treasurer or may appoint a separate treasurer. A candidate who serves as their own treasurer and who does not expect to receive or spend more than \$300 for the entire election is not required to file a Statement of Organization or contribution and expenditure reports. However, if at any time they exceed \$300 in either contributions or expenditures, they must then file a Statement of Organization and contribution and expenditure reports.

Amending information on this form

Any change in the information on this form must be filed within ten (10) days of the change. To notify the filing officer of a change in information, submit this form, completed in its entirety, and mark the "Amendment" box.

Discontinuing

You must file a final contribution and expenditure report that shows a zero balance, along with a completed SEL 220 with the "Discontinuation" box marked. The final report may be filed at any time.

2. Both Parts One and Two of the Candidate's Statement for County Voters' Pamphlet must be typed.
3. Statements will not be returned to candidates for proofreading.
4. All information cited or quoted from previously published material must include the source and date of publication.
5. Any endorsement by an individual or an organization, which was not previously made public, must be accompanied by a Statement of Endorsement, SEL 400.
6. The combined word total for both Parts One and Two must not exceed 325 words or numbers; excluding the seven words in the headings of Part One. If the candidate's statement exceeds the 325 word/number limit, the county clerk shall end the statement at 325 words or numbers.
7. "Part One: Required Information" must be signed by the candidate and "Part Two: Optional Information" must be signed by either the candidate or the person responsible for the content of that section.
8. Voters' pamphlets are prepared by each individual county. If you will be on the ballot in more than one county and you would like to have your statement and photograph in more than one county's voters' pamphlet, you must file a completed candidate's statement, photographs and filing fees with each county clerk separately.
9. You may choose to submit two (2) photographs with this candidate's statement; however, the photographs must meet the following criteria:
 - a. Be less than four (4) years old from the date of submission;
 - b. Be reproducible to a finished black and white picture that is 1.5 inches by 1.75 inches.
 - c. Have a plain background;
 - d. Show the face, neck and shoulders only.
10. The photograph must not show:
 - a. The hands or anything held in the hands;
 - b. The wearing of a judicial robe, a hat or a uniform;
 - c. The uniform or insignia of any organization.
11. All materials submitted by a candidate for inclusion in a county voters' pamphlet shall fit within 30 square inches of space.
