The governing bodies of the City and District have both unanimously approved resolutions calling for an election within both the City and the District on the question of annexation of the City to the District effective July 1, 2008.

There will be no increase in cost to District patrons if the annexation is approved. The current permanent tax rate, which may not exceed \$3.1976 per one thousand dollars of assessed value on improved property, will not change as a result of the annexation.

Water District to City of Medford**

Question: Should the Kings Highway Water District Liquidate and Transfer the District and its' Service Responsibilities to the City of Medford?

Summary: The City of Medford has annexed a substantial part of the area served by the Kings Highway Water District. Remaining District members have decreased over the past several months. Monthly income from the sale of water to diminishing members has resulted in insufficient revenue from the sale of water and services to its' members by the District to pay monthly expenses for the past several months. The Kings Highway Water District will be unable to continue operations and serve members within a very few months due to lack of funds. The Kings Highway Water District has signed an Agreement to dissolve, liquidate and transfer the District, its' assets and service responsibilities to the City of Medford, acting by and through its' Medford Water Commission. The City of Medford, acting by and through its' Medford Water Commission, has supplied water to the Kings Highway Water District for several years and the Agreement provides it will continue to supply water and necessary services to remaining members of the District.
